In 2017, HealthEast Care System initiated a build within Epic to replace a vendor based remote patient monitoring system. The functional build was completed in approximately six months. Patient cohorts with specific diagnoses were identified and recruited to use the system in a pilot program which started in 2018. The target population registry was Chronic Cardiac patients including diagnoses of Heart Failure, Cardiomyopathy, and Pulmonary Hypertension, with other inclusion and exclusion criteria. 128 patients were enrolled in the pilot program and instructed to enter data sets daily for one year via MyChart, the MyChart Mobile application, or via touch-tone responses on a phone. Outcomes for Hospitalizations and ER visits were tracked for the pilot program group and a control group for the previous two years and the year of enrollment. Favorable clinical outcomes and lowered total cost of care were evident during the year of enrollment and tracking. No vendor costs were incurred. The functionality can also be used for other diagnoses. The functionality was replicated in another instance of Epic in approximately 3 months.

What attendees may learn:

- How to collaborate with clinical operations to launch a successful remote patient monitoring platform
- How to engage clinical staff to build a platform that is efficient and clinically applicable to providers and nurses
- How to utilize Epic reporting capabilities to capture outcomes data to support total cost of care initiatives

- Clinical advantage and reduced cost of care can result from Epic users introducing this to their systems
